# **College Competition 2024**

You may notice ethnicity has been added – we would appreciate this being completed as it may assist with future funding applications.

#### GRADING

All teams grading to enter the **Premier Grade 1 – Premier Grade 4** will grade on **Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May 2024** 

All College teams grading to enter all **remaining grades** will grade on **Saturday 11th May 2024** 

#### START OF COLLEGE COMPETITION

All College teams will begin their 2023 competition on Friday 17th May 2024

#### COLLEGE REGISTRATIONS ARE DUE

All College registrations are due by **Friday 12<sup>th</sup> April 2024**. All registrations will be completed on our Friendly Manager registrations site. **All teams will choose the grade they would like to grade for at time of registration.** 



#### COMPETITION FORMATS

# Premier 1 (6 teams) Premier 2 (6 Teams)

All colleges wanting to grade for Prem 1 and Prem 2 at Tauranga Netball Centre will apply to grade via registration on Friendly manager. Schools will have the opportunity to apply for a maximum of 2 teams to grade for a position in Premier 1 & 2. There will be no automatic placement in these grades. Placement in these will be determined following grading. Teams that are not placed in these grades will automatically be placed in the grade under Prem 2. Please do not enter a team to grade for Prem grade unless they are up to this skill level. Following grading if there are teams that are automatically placed into the grade under Prem 2 and there are some concerns around a particular team being up to this level, management will have discretion to make a decision on which grade they shall be placed.

Five (5) weeks of round robin play.

Re-grading between sections. (There will be movement in every grade at the end of the round robin highest in each section will go up and lowest will move down including Prem grades) Tauranga Netball Centre discretion may be used to move further teams if score results justify this move.

Further five (5) weeks of round robin play.

Semi-finals and playoffs - Friday 9th August 2024

Finals and playoffs - Friday 16th August 2024

#### **Umpires**

Every team is required to provide an umpire with a minimum qualification of Centre Umpire Award with Zone Theory who are actively being developed to gain their NNZ Zone Award before the season ends, your umpire must be named on your team list, any changes to your umpire during the season, must be advised to the TNC Umpire Lead at <a href="mailto:umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz">umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz</a> by the Wednesday before your game. The Umpire will form a pool of umpires for this competition and will be allocated to the competition games each week from this pool. It is the responsibility of the teams to fulfil this requirement every week. All umpires will be paid monthly for games umpired by TNC directly.

# Premier 3 and Premier 4 Grades (12 Teams)

These grades will comprise of six (6) teams per grade. Placement in these grades will be determined following grading on Saturday 11th May 2024. There will be no allocation around the amount of teams from each school that can enter these grades. Those who are unsuccessful will be graded in Grades A, B, C or D dependent on placings during grading and at the discretion of TNC management.

Re-grading between sections. (There will be movement in every grade at the end of the round robin highest in each section will go up and lowest will move down. Tauranga Netball Centre discretion may be used to move further teams if score results justify this move.

#### **Umpires**

Every team must provide an umpire with a minimum of <u>Centre Umpire Award</u> who will be allocated to games in the Premier 3 and 4 grades for the duration of the season, your umpire must be named on your team list, any changes to your umpire during the season, must be advised to the TNC Umpire Lead at <u>umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz</u> by the **Wednesday** before your game. Any umpire who doesn't already have their Centre Award, <u>must attend an LTU workshop and be actively developed to gain their Centre award before the season ends.</u> See our website for further information and links to register for the LTU Workshops

# Collegiate A, B, C and D Grades

These grades will comprise of six (6) teams per grade. Placement in these grades will be determined after grading on Saturday 11th May 2024. Competition will start Friday 17th May 2024.

#### <u>Umpires</u>

Every team must provide an umpire who is fit and competent to umpire their own team's games for the duration of the season. It is the responsibility of schools to provide an umpire who is either appropriately qualified or who is up to date with the World Netball rules 2024 prior to entering a team. TNC offer a number of umpire development courses at the beginning of each season and these development opportunities must be utilised by the schools to ensure ongoing succession of umpires.

# Collegiate Year 9/10 Grades

These grades will start on Friday 17th May 2024 and will span 12 weeks. Depending on the number of teams registered this will determine how many grades and how many teams per grade.

Five (5) weeks of round robin play (There will be movement in every grade at the end of the round robin highest in each section will go up and lowest will move down including Prem grades) Tauranga Netball Centre discretion may be used to move further teams if score results justify this move.

Further five (5) weeks of round robin play Semi-finals and playoffs – **Friday 9th August 2024** Finals and playoffs – **Friday 16th August 2024** 

#### **Umpires**

Every team must provide an umpire who is fit and competent to umpire their own team's games for the duration of the season. It is the responsibility of schools to provide an umpire who is either appropriately qualified or who is up to date with the World Netball rules 2024 prior to entering a team. TNC offer a number of umpire development courses at the beginning of each season and these development opportunities must be utilised by the schools to ensure ongoing succession of umpires.

**7.40pm** Collegiate Grades A, B, C and D

These times are not confirmed we may need to move grades dependent on numbers, however we will endeavour to work with these times. Please be aware if your team is moved up or down following a round robin. This may affect the times they play.

There will be further discussion around possible game time rotation and movement of grades, this will be initiated at the Sports Co-ordinator school info sessions which are compulsory and are available on the dates below.

# **General Information for 2024**

# **Team Registrations**

All College Team Registrations are due by:

Friday 12th April 2024

A team may register up to twelve (12) players. Once a team exceeds the maximum number of twelve (12) players then one player must be deleted before another player can be added on our Friendly Manager site and the school will be charged \$10 per additional player. An online additional player form will need to be completed, this form can be found on our website under about us – official forms at <a href="https://www.tauranganetball.co.nz">www.tauranganetball.co.nz</a>. Please also refer to TNC regulations – championship player eligibility when adding a player.

#### **Points**

Win 4 points
Draw 2 points
Loss 0 points
Loss by 4 or less 1 points

Default Win 4 points awarded to the non-offending team Default Loss 0 points awarded to the offending team

#### Scorecards

The scorecard must be filled out prior to the game commencing. Initial and surname must be CLEARLY handwritten for all team members playing on the day. Players who have the same initial and surname, must print their full Christian name. A player, playing up for another team (within own school) must be clearly identified on the scorecard by an asterisk \* beside the persons' name and must state which team she is registered to.

To eliminate any discrepancies <u>a delegate from each team must score the game</u> together benchside (facing the Centre) as directed by the Umpires. The scorecard is the official score, and no dispute shall be entered into. Any incorrect scorecards may result in a default loss.

# School/Team Netball Convenor/Teacher in Charge

Each school/team must designate one person to act as their Netball Convenor/Teacher in Charge to liaise with the centre. The convenor/teacher in charge must keep in regular contact with the centre, must submit **all team registrations** by the due date and notify the centre of any changes (adding/deleting players), in fact everything and anything pertaining to your club/team.

#### **Team Duties**

TNC will continue with these again in 2024. All teams at some point or another during the season will be given duties which will be compulsory and if not completed the school will be fined \$30 so please ensure your team managers are made aware of this.

### **Defaults**

Defaults are of concern and **SHOULD NOT HAPPEN**. It is extremely frustrating and inconvenient for both the centre and non-offending teams. Teams who default with less than 24 hours notice will be charged a fee of \$30. Points will also be impacted as per the TNC regulations. Teams who participate in College Premier 1 grade will be forfeited 4 points for a default.

#### **Deferred Games**

Requests for deferred games has increased each season and although we like to be flexible, it has become apparent that a number of games are not being played at the official venue which impacts on the competition we provide to our members and spectators, the impacts on umpire coordination and facilitating the changes. Please refer to the regulations below and follow these guidelines.

#### 11.0 Deferred Games

a) Requests for deferred games will only be considered in exceptional circumstances as determined by TNC. Teams must apply in writing to TNC at least 14

days prior to the advertised date of the game. All decisions are at the discretion of TNC and are final.

b) All games must be played at the official venue and before the next scheduled game unless permission has been granted by TNC.

It is the responsibility of the schools to fulfil this requirement **every week** any changes to your umpire during the season, must be advised to the TNC Umpire Lead at <a href="mailto:umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz">umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz</a> by the <a href="mailto:umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz">Wednesday</a> before your game each week.

To help Colleges who find it hard to source an umpires, <u>first of all please ensure you utilise our LTU workshops</u> we run before the season to train your umpires or please contact Maree (Umpire Lead) at <u>umpirelead@tauranganetball.co.nz</u> if you would like to organise an LTU Workshop at your school or at the Centre.

All Umpires who umpire the College competition must register upstairs in the Harbourside Lounge their attendance with the Umpire Coaches on Duty before their game/s, and Umpires who are on the LTU (Learn to Umpire) pathway should add their game times to the Umpiring Coaching board.

<u>Please be reminded any verbal confrontations from players, coaches, spectators or supporters with umpires will not be tolerated.</u> Only the team captain may approach the Umpire for clarification at quarter/half time.

Tauranga Netball provides clear pathways for our umpires to develop their umpire skills. # **Good Sports**

Tauranga Netball in association with Hewletts Night n Day, introduced the Good Sports initiative with a focus on great behaviours while participating, spectating and officiating the game of netball.

The objective of this initiative is to reduce the number of incidents where inappropriate verbal abuse is used as the normal way we communicate during games.

Any incidents of misconduct will be dealt with in line with our Zero Tolerance and Complaint Regulations. These can be found in our Regulations which are on the website.

#### First Aid

All teams must provide their own medical kit and have it courtside each week. Ice is available from the downstairs office. First Aid kits are available for purchase at very competitive prices. Eftpos is available.

#### **Dress Code**

Correct netball uniform is to be worn by all teams at all times during play.

Players are not permitted to wear coloured stockings, rugby socks, skivvies or bike pants that hang below the uniform. Players need to set an example and take pride in the uniform they wear and the club/team they represent.

Players will be allowed to wear a black long sleeve thermal top under their uniform.

Dispensation may be approved for any medical issues. Approval must be sought from TNC management.

## Jewellery, Fingernails and Hair

As per rule 5.1.1 (iv) of the Rules of Netball:

Players may not wear anything that could endanger themselves or other players,

specifically:

- a) No adornment or jewellery may be worn other than a wedding ring which must be covered with tape
- b) A medical alert bracelet may be worn provided it is covered with tape
- c) Fingernails must be short and smooth
- d) Hair must be suitably tied back.

#### **Volunteers**
